Note also that all UNM SOL students must take Ethics, and to be admitted to the NM Bar, they must also pass the MPRE. The UNM School of Law may offer a one-credit pass/fail Bar Strategies seminar in the fall, and a one-credit Focused Bar Strategies seminar in the spring.
